The Town Council Meeting on Tuesday, March 26, 2019 was called to order at 6:35 p.m. There was a moment of silence and the Pledge of Allegiance was said. Chairman Cervoni convened the public hearing and stated that the COMMUNITY POOL PARK bond ordinance which is the subject of this public hearing is available to the public and may be obtained at this meeting from the Town Clerk.

Councilor Laffin moved, and the motion was seconded by Councilor LeTourneau, to read the title of the ordinance and to waive the reading of the remainder of the ordinance, incorporating its full text into the minutes of this meeting.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Bob Gross asked if Attonney Fasi was present. Chairman Cervoni answered yes and Mr. Gross then stated he assumes that Attorney Fasi is getting paid to be here.

Mr. Hine stated he took a look at the plan and he likes it. He indicated this is more than just the pool, it's a destination. He then asked if there are any plans to make this more accessible such as day passes and/or a longer timeframe. Mr. Gawlak replied yes, we have had discussions.

Ali Halringer, 197 Cheshire Road, commented that it would be great to get kids away from screens and be out and active.

Daryl Stancuna, 18 Old Village Circle, inquired about the bond.

Mr. Gross asked what is the \$625,000 for?

Mr. Chait stated it covers the complete design, permitting process and oversight of construction.

Mr. Savenelli explained they will be working with the winning bidder with the design. He then stated we just have a concept at this time.

Mr. Gross asked why this group scored so much higher since they are the highest priced. Mr. Savenelli responded stating that they have built pools all over the state, they are a team that works together and they have been doing this for years together.

Mr. Morgenstein indicated he wants us to get the best community pool as possible but to see the council just get this information tonight he asked why was it not available.

Mayor Dickinson stated there's a breath of information that takes place and we don't know what every person is looking for specifically.

Mr. Hine believes even if you are not going to make information available to the public, the Council should have the information.

Fran Rasino, Jackson Avenue, asked if in the design they are going to do food trucks or concession trucks and wants to know what is being considered. Mr. Gawlak stated he cannot say.

Chairman Cervoni called the public hearing adjourned.

Councilor Laffin moved, and the motion was seconded by Councilor Shortell, that the ordinance entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$625,000 FOR COMMUNITY POOL PARK DESIGN SERVICES AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUE OF \$625,000 BONDS OF THE TOWN TO MEET SAID APPROPRIATION AND PENDING THE ISSUANCE THEREOF THE MAKING OF TEMPORARY BORROWINGS FOR SUCH PURPOSE," a copy of which is attached hereto, be adopted.

Councilor Fishbein wants to know if it is our intention to pay cash and reimburse ourselves with the bond. Mr. Bowes responded yes.

Mayor Dickinson stated our intent is to build a pool and to keep all the money in one funding pattern which is what we are starting tonight.

Attorney Fasi noted Section 7 says if the interest on these bonds is going to be taxable then they should be issued. He then stated these bonds will never be taxed.

Councilor Morgenstein thanked the Committee for all their hard work. She wants to confirm that the \$625,000 right now is part of the whole big project but we will currently pay cash now from 2018. Mr. Bowes stated that we will pay whenever expenditures have to be paid. He went on to state they set up a bookkeeping fund for the \$625,000.

Councilor Testa is in favor of the community pool and he thinks we should try to continue and have a pool. He feels money will be an issue so he is a little out of sorts on the process.

Mr. Gawlak remarked that in September we made a presentation to get off and get going on the "concept" that we are looking to do.

Councilor Testa indicated he was out of commission for a little while so he just wants to catch up. He asked if the bid will have different square foot concepts and on the final design will we have any say or will it be decided tonight.

Mr. Chait explained there are a lot of steps in the RFP and one is cost estimate design.

Councilor LeTourneau is disappointed that we received this documentation tonight and he questioned how they came up with the \$625,000 figure.

Mr. Gawlak stated we worked closely with the Town Engineer and Purchasing Agent to get where we are today. TLB Architecture has been selected by the Qualification Bid Process.

Councilor Shortell thanked the Committee for all their work. He indicated he agrees that the backup items should be online and he agrees the pool season should go later. He asked if we commit to this tonight, what is the next step?

Mr. Gawlak stated this summer or early September would be the design after the approvals and we would be back here for approval of that.

Councilor Shortell stated he would like to see this stay in the \$4 to 6 million dollar figure and not go over. He stated to Mr. Gawlak that information was helpful to know and commented that we need a ceiling to know where to go. He went on to state with the departure of Bristol Meyers and the bond rating decline we need to watch our dollars.

Councilor Fishbein stated his understanding is that all that is before us tonight is to bond or not. Chairman Cervoni stated that is correct.

Mr. Chait stated the feasibility study said the pool was too big for our town. It was 13,000 square feet but ours should be under 10,000 square feet.

Councilor Fishbein asked if we intend to bond this. Mr. Bowes answered yes. Councilor Fishbein then asked if we will bond the full amount of the design? Mr. Bowes answered yes.

Councilor Laffin indicated he is okay with the information supplied here tonight. He thanked the Committee for all their hard work and actively listening to the whole community.

Chairman Cervoni stated he was a little concerned that we were not addressing the parking issue so if we scale back hopefully that addresses that.

Councilor Fishbein asked without that "cap" number do you have enough information to give this company for them to come up with plans. Mr. Gawlak answered yes.

Councilor Shortell stated we have been discussing this since October. He sees lots of laws that are hard to enforce but he thinks we need to impose laws to show we mean business. He noted that at the meetings, the police have said this is not a burden. He pointed out that an 18 year old is old enough to go to war, etc. This is targeting middle school and high school and the 18-21 year olds are buying it for them. He stated he will be supporting this.

Attorney Small stated she believes overall this covers what we have been discussing these past months.

Councilor Testa stated he had a problem with this up until a few months ago. He teaches high school and recently he had 16 and 17 year olds tell him they are flabbergasted at what 12 & 13 year olds are doing and not just vaping and these kids are upset. He has changed his mind and thinks possibly we can prohibit 18 year olds from buying it for 12-14 year olds. He explained with this law we basically are sending a message and others start to listen and a movement starts from here.

Chairman Cervoni commented on the number of youths getting tobacco products and stated we are in trouble as a society.
