# PUBLIC HEARING FY 2011 - 2012 BUDGET

### **RECORD OF VOTES AND MINUTES**

ATTENDANCE: Councilors Vincent Cervoni, Nick Economopoulos, Jerry Farrell, Jr., Craig C. Fishbein, John LeTourneau, Chairman Robert F. Parisi, Rosemary Rascati, John J. Sullivan and Vincent F. Testa, Jr. Mayor William W. Dickinson, Jr. and Comptroller James Bowes were also in attendance.

The meeting was called to order at 6:03 P.M.

#### **3.** Public Hearing for the Budget FY 2011-2012

Mayor Dickinson began with comments that summarized his budget letter addressed to the citizens of Wallingford. He stated that the total 2011-2012 proposed budget is \$141,448,848. He addressed the education budget stating that there is a .42% increase over that last fiscal year, included in the \$86,793,733 education budget. He said that the General Government portion of the budget, which includes some education costs, totals \$54,655,115, a .58% reduction over the 2011 year. He discussed the proposed distribution of the CRRA funds. He reported that the budget will require a tax rate of 25.22 mills, an increase of 4.7%. He addressed the Utilities budgets and reported changes in rates and usage of Electric, Water and Sewer in the Town of Wallingford. He spoke about being cognizant of the difficult economy as the budget was being developed. (The Mayor's letter is part of the record of this meeting.)
