Mr. Brodinsky asked the Town Council to tell the Committee at this meeting to make 'a turnbs up' or not, a decision to go forward or not. He said costs would be addressed with the Council in December. Councilor Farrell stated that if a Councilor has a concern, then a motion is in order. Mr. Brodinsky concurred and gave an example using the solar question that if the Committee is not to move forward with installing solar panels that they would need a motion, and a vote, to decide that question. He added that tonight is to present the schematic design only.

The Council discussed if the additional architectural fees for solar panels would become part of the of the original appropriation for the project. The Comptroller would need to look at the technical method of appropriating the funds specifically for the architect to address solar panels in the final design and that it would perhaps be through amending the present project bond. However, considering that the amount is only \$15,000 that that might not be appropriate to amend the bonding.

Some Councilors expressed concern over the lack of project costs. Mr. Brodinsky pointed out that tonight is the schematic design presentation, and then design documents come next, followed by a presentation of the cost.

Mr. Stein made a concise and thorough presentation of the recommendations for the roofing project for 2012 to the Town Council. He included many specific answers to questions from the Town Council. His presentation incorporated research and review of each of the eleven schools as to their current condition; synthesization of the information; drainage review; roof slope in relation to drainage; material selection included a brief review of the current 1-ply system on 90% of the roofs, which creates seepage and is not a good self-sealer type; a recommendation of the 3-ply system which increases warranty length of time; higher cost give roof more longevity; asphalt and odor with respect to empty schools and actual roofing work time of 20 to 25 days, depending on weather; metal roofs; project duration in two phases that would address half of the high schools one year and the other half the following year with the same approach to the middle schools; technicalities of solar panels the fact the there is expandability similar to 'plug-and-play', electricity generated will off-set electricity used, adds to stewardship of the environment and it sets an example for the community; solar does not require much maintenance but generally an annual inspection; roof walk-ways; remove roofs down to decking; insulation of roofs; increase in crews to complete high schools and middle schools in one season causes new problems; recommendation of white roofs because of reflectivity.

Mr. Brodinsky remarked that the committee is presenting middle ground on costs and not going overboard. Mayor Dickinson stated that everyone carefully weigh any added costs as every cost means something. It was stated that the bids will include 2-ply and 3-ply. Mr. Stein added that the design has not dominoed into a larger project. Each school will be bid separately but, Mr. Stein added, there may be cost savings to have only one project contractor. The 50% State of Connecticut

roof replacement reimbursement was discussed. Residents making comments included Messrs. Ben Martin, Geno Zandri and Bill Cumerford.
