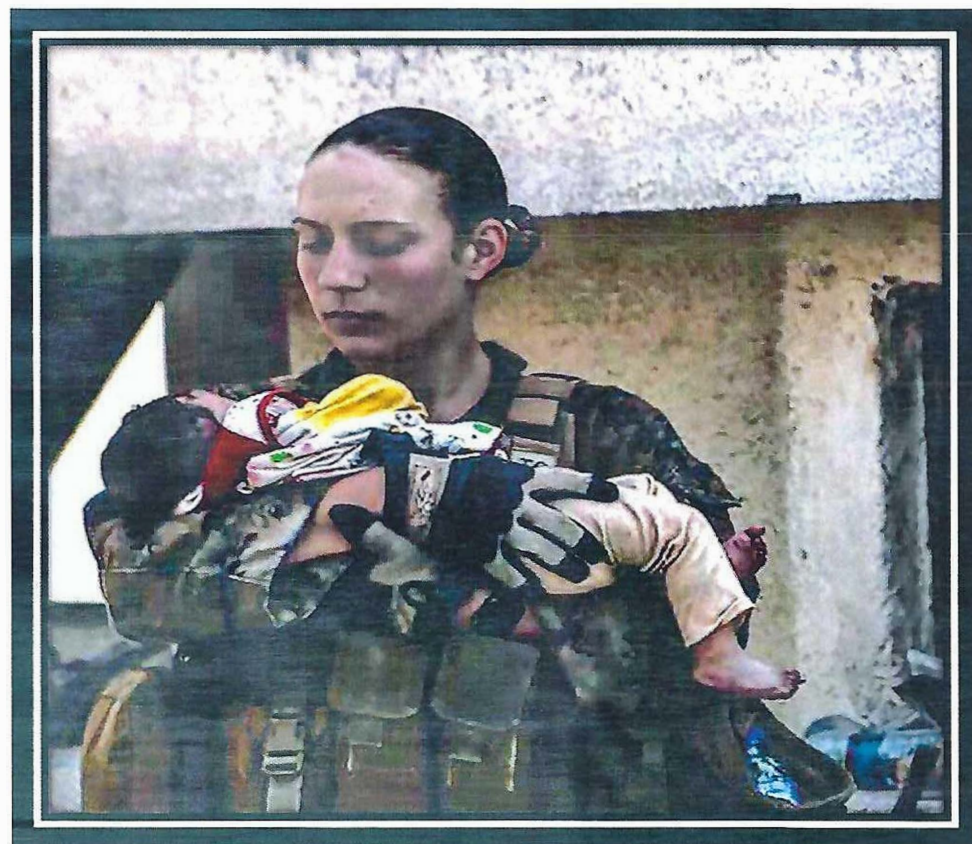

SUICIDE BOMB ATTACK

The day of the attack, August 26, 2021, was the deadliest day of the war for the U.S. since 2011 when 30 U.S. troops were killed during a Chinook helicopter crash 80 miles southwest of Afghanistan's capital.
