RECORD OF VOTES

The Town Council Meeting on Tuesday, May 6, 2025, was called to order at 6:30 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was said. Councilors in attendance were Thomas Laffin, Christina Tatta, Vincent Testa, Christopher Regan, Craig Fishbein, Autumn Allinson, Samuel Carmody, Jesse Reynolds and Chairman Joseph A. Marrone. Mayor Vincent Cervoni, Comptroller Tim Sena and Town Clerk Kristen Panzo were also present.

Councilor Laffin and Councilor Regan presented a presentation to reduce the burden on the taxpayers and reduce costs.

There was a discussion on how money would be allocated for certain big-ticket items in the budget. An example of that would be the Public Works Vacuum Truck for \$600,000. There was a discussion on trying to figure out what would be the best way to pay for certain items going forward. The possibility of reauthorizing expenditures from the Mayor's Budget was discussed.

MOTION WAS MADE TO bond the full \$165,000 for IT Cap Ex Projects.

This motion was withdrawn.

There was a discussion on how money should be appropriate in the budget. There was a discussion on what items from the budget can and should be bonded. There was a discussion on recruiting new talent for jobs because of the presentation that was presented to the council. There was a discussion about cuts made to jobs to save money in the new fiscal year. A hiring freeze was discussed as a possible way to save money going forward. The Police Department salary was discussed. The collecting of taxes assuming that the Town of Wallingford is 100% staffed was discussed. The Fire Department positions were discussed. The salary line for departments was discussed.

There was a discussion on the contingency fund and how much it was for each year and how much was spent each year. There was a discussion as to eliminating the contingency fund all together. The amount of the contingency fund was discussed because this amount of money is taxed, and the residents' taxes reflexed the amount each year. The money in the Reserves Account was discussed. There was a discussion about the grand list and how to grow the town so the taxes can be lowered.

The nonprofit and social services funding was discussed. There was a discussion on cutting back on services for some non-profit organizations. There was a discussion on certain organizations and how they need the money they asked for. An example would be the food pantries. The Boys and Girls Club was discussed. There was a discussion on a better way to get information from the nonprofit organizations and what type of information should be needed to receive larger amounts of money. The Town Council Budget Workshops were discussed and how they really were not utilized very well. The money that Columbus House asked for was discussed. They had asked for \$90,000. The shelter that they run in town was discussed.

There was a discussion on the upgrades to the town hall including the new technology and how possibly some of that can wait till the next fiscal year. Products that are shipped from other countries were discussed because of the increased tariffs for shipping products. There was a discussion about new technology to keep up with the times. The Town of Wallingford has not had any upgrades to technology in about 40 years. There was a discussion about possibly bonding the hardware for the technology upgrades. There was a discussion on what exactly can be bonded versus what should be paid in full.

There was a discussion about the Board of Education and what can possibly be cut to their budget. They make up 60% of the town's budget. There was a discussion in the decline of students each year. There was a discussion on cutting the mayor's proposed budget for the BOE. There was a discussion on how hard BOE worked this year to create a bare bones budget. There was a discussion on how the town should find ways to fund the BOE. There was a discussion on how much the BOE pays for each student and if the student population drops you should be paying less for each student. The discussion of students per classroom was discussed. The number of teachers was discussed. There was a discussion on how everyone in town needs to take a hit this year in their budget. There was a discussion on how certain grants are no longer available for the BOE to use. There was a discussion on changes in how the BOE is funded. There was a discussion on the Minimum Budget Requirement adjustment and how the BOE was not taking it each year.

MOTION WAS MADE TO approve budget adjustments, with the adjustments on page 3 of the packet to eliminate the claw back provisions except for the pool which was amended to the \$900,000 and the police officers were put back in on page 4. Change the Clerk Typist II to the Account Clerk.

There was a discussion on tabling this motion. There was a discussion on just eliminating the contingency line all together.
