Item 4: Co-Chair Announcements

The Town is now disconnecting utilities at 352 Main Street; demolition will then go out to bid. Cathy will ask Town Engineer Alison Kapushinski if this has been budgeted and if any remediation is required before the demolition. The property is connected to town water supply, so Cathy requested a drinking fountain (for humans and dogs), as well as a bike rack and maybe a picnic table.

The CT Department of Transportation will post signage about trail closure when they are working on the Route 15 bridge replacement. It should be finished by November.

Grants update: Robin Corrigan applied for a Rotary Club grant and got \$500 for the pollinator garden. Rotary has scheduled an award luncheon at noon on Wednesday, June 17, at Serafino's Restaurant, for \$25/ticket.

As soon as Mary Mushinsky signs off, we will be set up to receive donations via Zeffy.com. Sally Tremaine will be the contact person for Zeffy. We can add a donation button to Facebook, and we can set up a merchandise page. There was some discussion about how to confirm payment before giving merchandise premiums to donors, but this should become apparent after we have activated the account. Before Celebrate Wallingford, we will train members on how to solicit and accept donations at public events.

Signage update: There have been more changes to the kiosk map design. Cathy emailed Edward Waters to ask about the status. When the design is finalized, Fossil Graphics will produce the map/sign replacement for the Hall Avenue entrance.

The June 20 “Red, White & YOU” Parade kicks off at 10 AM. Details will be sent to us shortly. We will have our banner on poles mounted on wheeled bases, and we will carry Pollinator Pathway signs. Two high school students have volunteered to wear bee costumes.
