## TOWN OF WALLINGFORD, CONNECTICUT TOWN COUNCIL MEETING TUESDAY JULY 12, 2022 6:30 P.M. RECORD OF VOTES & MINUTES

The Town Council Meeting on Tuesday, July 12, 2022 was called to order at 6:35 p.m. There was a moment of silence and the Pledge of Allegiance was said. Councilor Testa asked for a brief explanation of program. There was discussion with Ms. Kapushinski about the program.

Councilor Fishbein asked where are we are with this procedurally. He then asked if there are plans for other areas for improvement, replacing sidewalks. Ms. Kapushinksi answered yes.

Councilor Zandri confirmed if we don't get grant then we don't need match. He asked when we do work on sidewalks, how do we review tree roots? Ms. Kapushinski stated when we look at replacement we consult with the tree warden. He stated trimming roots damages trees and he feels we need to be more concerned with these changes and look at the entire thing as a project.

Councilor Tatta has two concerns with Hall Avenue improvements; underground electric and weeds coming through pavers.

Councilor Carmody stated we haven't received grant and asked about a contingency plan. Ms. Kapushinksi said we would keep looking for grants. He then asked Ms. Kapushinski to explain zones. Ms. Kapushinksi explained there are 13 zones done to keep prices reasonable. Councilor Carmody asked if we ever deviate from plan. Ms. Kapushinksi stated we haven't, we address and repair. Councilor Carmody asked how long it takes to get through zone and Ms. Kapushinski replied depending on area 3- 4years. Councilor Carmody feels we should be able to make exceptions for the safety/beautification of the downtown area.

The Mayor stated it's a slow process and explained in the past a contractor was doing the design work now Engineering does it.

Councilor Laffin asked how many years a patch lasts and Ms. Kapushinski replied it depends on snow removal and trees.

Councilor Fishbein stated he's impressed with Ms. Kapushinski's knowledge.

Councilor Fishbein agrees with Councilor Carmody and agrees with the zone process. He feels we should focus on downtown area.

The Mayor stated we must make an effort to correct in a reasonable time and that's why black top is used.

Councilor Zandri said there's a long stretch near Parsons Street where an entire section should be replaced and noted there is no wheelchair or stroller access. Ms. Kapushinski stated we do look at ADA ramps.

Councilor Testa said new installation initiates from Mayor's Office. He would like to get an idea of what it would be for town wide replacement program. He stated he hopes Administration will pursue this.

Debbie Gross inquired about the cost difference when replacing the sidewalk with concrete versus replacing it with patch. Ms. Kapushinski replied \$100-\$500 starting point.

Mr. Gross asked who writes the grant and Ms. Kapushinski stated Susan Schott. He then asked who files reports and Ms. Kapushinski answered Engineering.

Fran LaFrance-Proscino asked if there is a better way to do patches because she feels it needs to be flatter. Ms. Kapushinski said they check the work after its done and noted they have to reach elevation.

Barbara Kapi commented about poor maintenance at town hall indicating cracked tile, sections of molding coming from wall, ladies room is spray-painted and sinks are worn.
