SUBJECT: BUDGET AMENDMENTS SALES/PURCHASED POWER/GROSS EARNINGS TAX

Gentlemen:

During the course of the settlement discussions, this writer advised the Public Utilities Commission, as well as the Town Council, of the need to amend the Electric Division budget for the current fiscal year, 1988 - 1989. Because of new charges, by our wholesale supplier and erroneous data from which forecasted sales data was generated, budget amendments are necessary for those areas, plus the State of Connecticut gross earnings tax.

Utilizing the most current information, it is recommended that the following adjustments to the 1988 - 1989 budget be recommended to the Mayor and Town Council.

The seemingly large net income will fall out as a result of maintaining

the present rate structure in anticipation of stabilizing those rates through the period ending December, 1992. This will be consistent with the W-3 rate settlement which will fix the wholesale charges for this same period. In addition, with the expected plan to develop a generation facility to replace the Pierce capacity, additional income will be necessary to partially fund this project and ultimately to pay for debt service on projected borrowings to finance the balance of the program.

By designing rates' to generate the \$2,600,000+, the statutory requirements will be met since the rate will cover four years during which time the average gross plant should be approximately \$33 - \$35,000,000. Unless there is a significant increase in sales over the four year time frame, net income will probably drop during that time.

It is important that any action in amending the current years budget take place during December or January, since this will be the starting point for work on the 1989 - 1990 budget. If you need any additional background on the subject, please contact me.

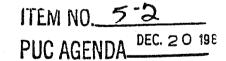
